Hello everyone,

This week we are exploring stories which have vegetables in them! We hope you have fun exploring some of these stories this week. Examples of books you can read together this week are.... **The Enormous Turnip**, **Jack and the Beanstalk**, **The Princess and the Pea**, **Pumpkin soup**

## 'We are Authors' - Vegetable Tales

1. How many different stories can you find with vegetables in them? Look for stories on 'youtube' or on the website '[oxford owl reading](#)' (This website is free and you can browse the ebook library).

Write a list of all of the story books you find with vegetables in them. Which story did you like the best? Can you draw a picture of this story and write a sentence about why you liked this story best?

2. I'm sure your adult will read lots of stories to you over the next few weeks but we would like you to read one of the following books to your adult! Go to the 'oxford owl reading' website and have a go at reading 'The Big Carrot' (oxford level 1+) or for a bigger challenge 'Leek Hotpot' (oxford Level 3) to your grown up. Use your phonics to sound out new words and see how many words you can read from sight.

3. Lets see if you can recognise your numbers 1 - 20 and beyond. Can you use chalk to write these numbers outside or can you write them on some paper? Start with zero and see how high you can go? Think about how you form each number.

Number Challenge: For your Maths passport you need to recognise your numbers to 20. If you can already do this maybe challenge yourself by writing your numbers to 50 or even 100.

Use the hundred square below to play hunt the number! Ask each other questions and take turns to find the number. For example, Can you find number 52? Can you find the number which is one more than 8? (9). Can you find the number that is one less than 63? (62). Ask questions that suit your childs ability in maths.

Play this together and take turns to ask each other questions and to find the answers.
