This week we are talking about Tales from around the world. But we also like to explore different cultures, games, and music because we love diversity.

1. Can you find out about a game played in a different country? (If you struggle with this then tell us about one of your favourite games/board games that you play at home).

How many people do you need for this game? What are the rules of this game?

Write down the game name and the rules so we can play it when we come back to school.

2. Can you listen to some music from a country that is special to you, dress up in your family's traditional clothes or learn a traditional dance from this country? Does your family have a traditional song from their country that they can teach you? If they do, see if you can learn this song and sing it. Another option is to sing one of your favourite songs that we sing in class and teach it to your family. You could even make a video of your song and send it to us.

3. I have some challenges for you:

A) If you have 10 bottles and 3 of them get broken. How many bottles are left?

B) If you have 5 ice cubes and 2 of them melt. How many ice cubes are left?

C) If you have 7 chocolates and you eat 4, how many chocolates are left?

D) If you have 3 fish fingers and you eat 3 of them, how many fish fingers are left?

E) Now can you create your own challenge for your family to solve?

If you want an extra challenge, try these:

A) If you have 20 bottles and 5 of them get broken. How many bottles are left?

B) If you have 15 ice cubes and 7 of them melt. How many ice cubes are left?

C) If you have 17 chocolates and you eat 4, how many chocolates are left?

D) If you have 13 fish fingers and you eat 13 of them, how many fish fingers are left?

Have a go at writing down your math sentences ($10-3=7$) and draw some pictures if you need to help you to work out the answers.
