Hello everyone,

This half term our topic will change to **Pirates and Under the Sea**. We have loved seeing the photos of what you have been doing and reading your emails. Please continue keeping us posted on your progress when you can. We love hearing from you!

Here are the 3 activities for this week, we hope you enjoy them.

'Pirates and Under the Sea'

1. Listen to or watch the story '**Pirates Love Underpants**' by Claire Freedman and Ben Cort.

If you do not have this book at home you will be able to find a video of it on YouTube. Please follow the link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8_Y1bEzA8 (If possible, read it a few times together during the week, so the story becomes familiar).

The pirates used a treasure map in the story. Can you make a treasure map? You could tear the edges of a piece of paper and stain the paper with cold tea bags/ coffee, wait for it to dry, then draw a treasure map. Don't forget 'X' marks the spot! Grown-Ups you could even make a treasure map for your home or garden. Then see if your little one could have a go at following it to find some 'treasure'!

Or

If you don't have access to the internet, you could talk with your child about how pirates sail on big ships on the wavy sea and search for treasure. You could get your child to do some actions and role play, for example; sailing on a big boat and searching for treasure.

2. Sing '**Row, Row, Row Your Boat**' watch this song clip if you don't know it.

3. **Water Play - Floating and Sinking**. This can be done in the bath, paddling pool or a bowl of water. Gather some objects from around the house, for example a ball, an apple, toy car, spoon etc. Before you put each item in the water, ask your child to guess if it will float or sink. You may have to show what floating and sinking means first.
