Farm Animals and Pets

1. Do you have a pet? Take a photo or draw a picture of your pet and then write some instructions telling us how you look after them. Can you tell us their name? How old they are? What they eat and how you keep them healthy?

OR

If you are like me and you do not have a pet then don't worry, you can help me to find out about all the animals that live on a farm. Can you draw a picture of a farm and draw the animals that would live there? Challenge yourself and write a list of all the animals that might live on a farm. Let's see who can think of the most farm animals this week!

2. Please login to 'OxfordOwl.co.uk' this is a reading at home site which has a free library of ebooks. You just need to supply an email address and password and you can access this site for free. Read the book '**A Dogs Day**'. This is an Oxford level 2 book. Children, you should all be able to use your phonics and have a go at reading this book to your adult.

Also, on the Oxford Owl site you can look at the ebook '**Incredible Animals**'. This book is oxford level 4 so you will need your adult to read this book to you. This is an information book. Whilst you explore this book with your adult can you talk about the differences between story books and information books.

OR

If you cannot access the internet then please talk to your child about the differences between story books (fiction) and information books (non-fiction books). Explore the books you have at home and see if you can find an information book that you can then share together. What interesting facts can you find out?

3. This week we are practising doubling numbers. We do this by adding the same two numbers together. 1+1, 2+2, 3+3 4+4 etc.....

If I have 2 ducks, how many legs altogether 2 + 2

If I have 2 dogs, how many legs altogether 4 + 4

If I have 2 spiders, how many legs altogether 8 + 8

See if you can learn your doubles to 10. If you find this easy then continue with your doubles to 20..... 11+11, 12+12, 13+13 etc....
