Let's continue thinking about different animals.

Endangered Animals

1. Read or watch a 'YouTube' video of the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. Say the days of the week to your adult. Can you sing the days of the week song, that we sing in class, to your adult? How many days are in a week? What day is it today, what day was it yesterday? What day will it be tomorrow?

For an extra challenge, can you learn the months of the year. How many months are there? What month is your birthday? How many days does that month have in it? How many days are in a year?

2. Think about things you do each day. Our day can be split into the morning, afternoon, evening and night. Split your page into four and label them morning, afternoon, evening and night. Draw a picture of something that you do for each section of the day.

For an extra challenge write a sentence under each picture describing what you are doing.

3. Hopefully, in the previous activity you all said that you sleep at night but not all animals sleep at night. Can you think of the word we use to describe animals that sleep during the day and are awake at night?

These animals are called **nocturnal!**

Can you find out which British wildlife are nocturnal? Draw a picture and name the animal.

For an extension you can write a list of nocturnal animals from all around the world. How many different nocturnal animals can you find?
