This week we are thinking about endangered animals!!!!

Endangered Animals

1. Some animals are very rare and endangered, for these reasons they are protected. But what does 'endangered' mean? and which animals are endangered?

Endangered means that there are not many of these animals left in the world.

With your adult's help do some research about these animals, such as: Amur leopard, Black Rhino, Bornean Orangutan, Cross River Gorilla, Sunda Tiger....

Look at the pictures of these endangered animals from around the world

Now you are ready to draw a picture about your favourite creature. What is it called? can you write one fact about it?

2. Do you know that a long time ago people used to write messages and put them inside glass bottle and throw them into the water?

Write a message to go inside a bottle. Who would you like to send the message to? What would you write in it? Do not forget to use your phonics sounds, finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.

When you finish your message, you can make a beautiful picture under it.

3. This week we are taking about time: how do we measuring time? We use clocks to measuring time. In the past people used to measure time in different ways. Some of them use the Meridian, some sand glass, and others used to put a stick in the soil or sand and looked at its shadow.

Should we try to do the same?

Take a stick or a straw, or a pencil. Now use something to hold it straight. Make sure you see the shadow of the stick. You can use paper or some chalk on the floor to check the changes during the day. Draw a line every time you see the shadow is not where it was before. What do you notice?

While you are waiting for the shadow to change, we can talk about clock and time.

The clock has two arms: one long and one short. The short hand tells you what the hour is and the long hand tells you the minutes.



This clock says 3 o'clock because the short hand is on 3 and the long hand is on the 12



This clock says 6 o'clock because the short hand is on 6 and the long hand is on the 12

Can you make a clock? What times are you going to choose? Can you show me three examples? If you want to challenge yourself you can try showing me half past, for example 3:30, 6:30.
