

Birch and Tulip Home Learning for Monday 15th June

In Maths, now that you have used length words and have used same sized objects to measure. Let's move on to using a ruler. You will need a ruler showing centimetres. We write this as cm. One very important thing to remember is that we always start measuring from 0 cm.



What is the length of the chocolate bar?



Top measuring tips

- 1. Place your object against the ruler starting at 0 cm
- 2. Read along the numbers until you find the end of your object
- 3. Find which number the end of your object is closest to.
- 4. This is the length of your object.

Now you are ready to practise measuring different objects using your ruler.


Challenge: Can you find 2 objects shorter than 10cm, 2 objects longer than 20cm and 2 objects that are the same length?


In English, let's look at another fantasy world setting, 'Tiddler' by Julia Donaldson. It's a story about a story telling fish!
