Can you compare the volume in a container by describing whether it is full, nearly full, empty or nearly empty?


Find lots of different containers so that you can explore!

Can you compare 2 bottles, which has more, which has less


Challenge:

Challenge:

Make or draw your own alien and write about him/her/it. What's it called? What does it look like? How does it move? Where does it live? What does it eat?

In Science, we have learnt about mammals and reptiles. Let's take a look at amphibians.

These are tricky because some of them look like reptiles. Amphibians are cold blooded just like reptiles and lay eggs too. They live their first part of their lives in the water and their last part on the land. When they hatch, amphibians have gills so they can breathe in the water.



What else can you find out about amphibians?

How else are they different to reptiles?

Challenge: Can you add last week's reptiles and some amphibians to your World map or Continent chart?
