Here are Block 6 Week 3 Monday's activities:

1. In Maths, we are going to learn about **division** using pictures. I would like you to solve the following word problem using pictures and write a **division** sentence.

*I have 16 doughnuts in a bag.
I would like to share them in between 4 friends.
How many doughnuts will each friend get?*

Draw an image and write a calculation to represent the problem.

Extension: Write a mini-story for the calculation $12 \div 6$. Draw an image to illustrate.

Simplification: Draw the picture for the word problem above and use pasta and bowls to represent the doughnuts and the friends.

2. In English, we are going to **find adjectives that describe sounds**. I would like you to listen very carefully to some animal sounds. Click on this link:

Listen to the sound of the grasshopper and write a list of adjectives that describe those sounds. Then listen to the cricket. What type of sound is that? You can use a thesaurus to help you find synonyms (different words with a similar meaning).

Simplification: Choose two animals and describe their sounds.

Extension: Choose more than two animals and also write similes to describe the sounds
e.g. Like a seesaw cutting a tree trunk, etc.

3. In Geography, you need to understand **geographical similarities and differences** through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the U.K. and a small area in a contrasting country (Brazil). **You have to look at two aerial pictures**, one from **Grove Park** and the second one from the **Amazon area** in Brazil to compare them.

Simplification: Talk about how many roads you see. Which map has more? Why? What is the symbol for a road on a map?

Extension: Find out what the symbols on maps mean.
