Hello everybody-I hope you are still enjoying the sunshine. We continue to look forward to hearing from you. Today, I have set another four tasks and another riddle!

Riddle: What can you hear, but not see or touch, even though you control it?

Now here are your 3 activities: **Only check the answers when you complete the task!**

Victorians: Read through the pdf slides to find out which countries were part of the British Empire in the Victorian era and to be able to locate them on a world map. Afterwards, complete one of the three differentiated tasks below.

- Worksheet 1A shows a map labelled with the countries of the British Empire. Colour in each of the labelled countries.
- Worksheet 1A shows a map labelled with the countries of the British Empire. Colour in each of the labelled countries. When finished, compare each of the countries to the continents map on worksheet 1B and note which continent each of the listed countries is in.
- Use worksheet 1C, to find each of the countries of the British Empire listed in an atlas or world map and label and colour on the blank map. Use numbers or colours as a key to label the countries.

Extension: Get the Continents Cards and the British Empire Countries cards. cut out the cards and decide which continent each of the countries belongs to and put into piles (NB: countries listed are the modern country names as opposed to what some of the countries of territories were called in 1897). • When you have finished, read out the answers on worksheet 1D. Give yourself a point for every country you match correctly.

- 3 Maths: For the next few weeks, we'll be learning about a special kind of maths called Geometry. The fourth concept we'll be looking at will be polygons. Extension: Complete the attached reasoning skills maths puzzle. Use maths to support your reasoning.

- 4 Art: Read through the pdf slides to find out who the Pre-Raphaelites were and explore their artwork. Afterwards, complete one of the differentiated tasks.
- Look through the picture cards carefully and identify similarities between the paintings. Choose the picture you like best to recreate. This could be done using watercolours, pastels or colouring pencils. If you're less confident as an artist, then choose one of the green picture cards as they are less complex paintings.

 - Look through the picture cards carefully and identify similarities between the paintings. Choose the picture you like best to recreate. This could be done using watercolours, pastels or colouring pencils. If you're more confident as an artist, then choose one of the red picture cards as they are more complex and detailed paintings.
 - If you fancy something different, create your own artwork in the style of the Pre-Raphaelites. Can you think of a scene from a story you would like to paint? You could use a scene from a Bible story, a Roman or Greek myth, a medieval story (e.g. Arthur pulling the sword from the stone), etc. Take some time to sketch some ideas for your painting and then create your Pre-Raphaelite art.
