

Tulip and Birch Class Home Learning Challenges for 6th July 2020

In English, we are going to look at information books. These are different to fantasy books as they tell us facts rather than stories.

If you have some information books on animals at home, take a look! Otherwise there are lots online. If you search for (+animal name) non fiction reader or non fiction books about (+animal name) there are lots to choose from.

Find some on your favourite animal and have a read!

Photographs - give you more information on what the writing is about.

Captions - these are short sentences away from the other writing. Sometimes in boxes or different writing.

Headings - big writing at the top of the page to tell you what you can read about.

Labels - these are around photos or pictures telling you the names of parts of the body.

Contents - a page at the front showing where to find out special information with a page number. (these might not be on online books)

Glossary - this is a page at the back of the book explaining technical words.



Challenge: Can you find some of these features of information books?

In Maths, let's practise some passport targets. Use 'Whack A Mole' on ICT games to practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. You can also practise counting backwards from any number to 100 using this game too. <https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/whackAMole/index.html> When you run up the stairs or walk along the street try counting with each step you take. 'Duck Shoot' is another great game for practising counting in multiples - you have to count on the missing numbers. <https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/duckShoot/index.html>

Challenge: If you can already count in 2's, 5's and 10's why not try to learn the 2 times table. You could practise this by grouping objects and singing a times table song like this: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kWcrmsDRmQw>
