

Tulip and Birch Home Learning Challenges 29th June 2020

Hi Everyone, Here are your new challenges.

In Maths, let's take a look at Position and Direction. Use left, right, backwards and forwards to describe your movements.

'Snakes and Ladders' and 'Twister' are great games to play to practise using this language. You could mark out a route for a family member.

Describe the route your partner needs to take using the words 'left', 'right', 'forwards' and 'backwards'.

Challenge: Can you create a grid map to move a small toy to different places. Use the words 'left', 'right', 'forwards' and 'backwards' to describe the movements.



In English, let's read another story, 'The Magic Bed'. It's available on YouTube if you don't have it at home. This one is about a boy who goes on adventures on his magic bed. What would your magic word be? After looking at the places he visits can you write a super sentence to describe the different characters. That's 2 adjectives and a verb.



Like this, 'The shiny, happy dolphin was jumping in the sea'.

Challenge: Pick the place you would most like to visit in the book. Can you write some sentences to describe what it's like?

In Science, we have looked at lots of different animal groups. Now, let's look at those animals that like to come out at night. They are called Nocturnal animals.



Can you say what type of animals these are? What are they called? Do you know anything about any of them already? Can you find out where they live? What do they eat?

Challenge: Can you draw these nocturnal animals and write: Which parts of the animals' bodies do you think might be useful to them at night? How might these body parts help them? What do you think these animals might be doing at night while we are sleeping?
