Draw a picture of your favourite Super hero and write about them. What are they good at? What makes them Super?

Visit the library and find a book about Super heroes. Share this book with an adult at home. Bring your book to school to share with the class.

Can you help cook a healthy dinner for your family? Take photos of your delicious meal and stick them in your home learning book to share in school. Can you write a list of ingredients for your meal?



In class we have been talking about where vegetables and fruit grow before they arrive at the super market. Can you make a picture showing the vegetables that grow above the ground and vegetables that grow below the around?

You could use various materials to make your picture for example, paint, colouring pens or you could cut out and stick pictures of vegetables from food magazines.

Can you research an artist who uses food in their pieces of artwork? For example, the Italian artist 'Giuseppe Arcimboldo'. Can you create your own piece of art work copying his style and take a photo of it?





We have talked about where our food comes from. We know vegetables grow on a farm but these are not always farms in England. Can you visit your local supermarket and look at the packaging of the food. How many different countries can you find? Can you label these countries on a map to show where the food has travelled from?

For example Strawberries from Egypt

Practise counting to 60. How many of these numbers can you see as you walk to school? Look at numbers on doors, buses and car registrations. Take photos or write a list of these numbers in your home learning book.
