<p>Choose a character from a traditional tale. Draw it and write a description about it e.g. how it looks, how it behaves and whether it is a 'good' or a 'bad' character.</p>		<p>Choose a material and find as many different objects made of that material. Can you find photos in a magazine and stick them in your book too?</p>		<p>Make a homemade telescope to look at the stars and moon. You can decorate it and bring it to school.</p> 	
<p>Read different traditional tales. Make a list of them in your homework book. Choose your favourite one and say why you liked it.</p>		<p>Find a material that can be changed by actions of e.g. squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. Describe what the properties of this material are.</p>		<p>Find out some facts about the first black astronaut who travelled to space. Write it in a fact file or a report.</p>	
<p>Poetry – explore with words and make up a seasonal poem about autumn.</p>		<p>Make a homemade catapult to show how pushes and pulls can cause a movement.</p>		<p>Find out what a kaleidoscope is and who made them first. Make one of your own.</p>	
<p>Make a mask of the wolf, Grandma or Little Red Riding Hood. Try to find old clothes to make a costume of your favourite character in the story. We'll use them in the lessons for Hot Seating!!</p>		<p>Choose a 'secret number'. Can you write some clues about it e.g. is it odd or even, is it a 2-digit number, it is greater than.. but less than...it is in the 2 times tables, etc.</p>		<p>Use Google Earth to find your home address and explore satellite images in your local area. Make a simple map to show your home, your street and any other things you see in the images.</p>	
<p>Think of a twist for the story of Little Red Riding Hood. A different ending? What is she carrying in her basket? Is the wolf really that bad? Isn't she a spoiled girl?</p> 		<p>Play a game called 'Target 20'. You will need a dice. Play with someone at home. Take turns for each player to roll the dice and each time you add on to the last number. The first person to reach 20 is the winner.</p>		<p>Observe an animal in its habitat. Draw it or take pictures of it. A habitat could be as small as under a log or as big as the Quaggy river in Chinbrook Meadows. Remember to leave the animal where you found it</p>	
<p>What happens the 5th of November? Write a little rhyme to explain to someone why we remember this date.</p>		<p>Here are 3 digit cards: <input type="text" value="6"/> <input type="text" value="7"/> <input type="text" value="8"/> Place the digits in the number sentence. <input type="text"/> <input type="text"/> + <input type="text"/> = How many different totals can you find?
