Year 3 Term 1

In Year 3, the children will become time-travellers and will explore life in the Stone Age, where people had to hunt and gather their food – not just go to the supermarket! Throughout this topic the children will compare their lives now with lives of people in the Stone Age. They will explore how Britain has evolved since the first humans arrived and learn about prehistory in Britain through the Stone Age, Bronze Age and the Iron Age.

The children will have the opportunity to use a range of general and specific vocabulary and improve their enquiry and questioning skills. They will read Stone Age themed stories, information books, retell stories, as well as writing their own reports.
